- (i) He put in place elements of democratic governance by consulting important personalities in the community before taking a decision
 - (ii) He formed a well-trained Islamic army.
 - (iii) He appointed judges/clerics of high integrity who instituted punishment as prescribed in the Holy Quran
 - (iv) He appointed local rulers / council of elders who advised him on important matters affecting believers.
 - (v) He helped the Holy Prophet Muhammed to embark on Jihad
 - (vi) He taught Muslims the Hajj rites or rituals.
 - (vii) He brought unity among Muslims and crushed all rebellions.
 - (viii) He gave all his wealth for the service of Allah.
 - (ix) Under his rule as Caliph, Islam spread to many parts of the world.
 - (x) He was physically tortured, but stood firm for the cause of Islam.
- (b) What two lessons can be learnt from the contribution of Caliph Abu Bakr? 5 marks**
- (i) Muslims should be willing to use their wealth for the work of Allah
 - (ii) Muslims should have the courage to give up all they have in order to serve Allah faithfully.
 - (iii) Muslims should endure all forms of trials and tribulations for the sake of Allah.
 - (iv) We should be honest, truthful and trustworthy/loyal in all their deeds.
 - (v) We should help the poor and needy.
 - (vi) We should endeavour to be steadfast.
 - (vii) Muslims should be brave and courageous to fight in the name of Allah.
 - (viii) Muslims must respect and fear Allah.

- 2. (a) Explain the term *puberty*. 4 marks**
- (i) It is the transition from childhood to adulthood.

- (ii) It is the period of growth from childhood to adulthood. Rites are performed to mark puberty in some cultures.
- (iii) It is a stage of transformation in the human body from childhood to adulthood. It is the period between the ages of 10 and 19 years.
- (iv) A stage where an individual becomes capable of reproduction.

(b) State three emotional changes that are associated with puberty. 6 marks

- (i) Curiosity to know things around. They become adventurous to explore self and environment.
- (ii) Experience of changes in mood, such as, getting angry, happy or excited about minor issues.
- (iii) Development of interest in the opposite sex / engagement in friendly relationship – boy/girl relationships.
- (iv) Display of shyness when naked
- (v) Display of rebellious attitude
- (vi) Fear / worry / anxiety about the future.
- (vii) Engagement in activities that bring joy and excitement
- (viii) The desire to engage in sexual activities
- (ix) The desire to be independent and free from control / a feeling of maturity
- (x) The crave for love and care/affection

(c) Explain four reasons why puberty rites are performed. 10 marks

- (i) It is a special ritual ceremony performed to usher a person from childhood to adulthood
- (ii) It enables a person to be recognized as a fully-fledged responsible member of the family and society.
- (iii) It teaches girls to be obedient to parents.
- (iv) It prevents pregnancy before the initiation ceremony.
- (v) It brings honour to the initiate, parents and family.
- (vi) Initiates sometimes acquire capital through gifts for her future.
- (vii) It enables girls to get good husbands.
- (viii) The initiate girls acquire knowledge about good womanhood.
- (ix) Helps the initiate to know about the traditions of the society.
- (x) The initiates learn to live, work and play with others – cooperation.
- (xi) The girls have the right to get married.
- (xii) It helps them to become good parents.
- (xiii) It teaches the initiates to be committed to God.

3. (a) Describe four types of Christian prayers. 8 marks

- (i) Prayer of thanksgiving – It is said to thank or show appreciation for what God has done.
- (ii) Prayer of intercession – This is prayer said for the benefit of other. Eg, the sick, the nation or against accident.
- (iii) Prayer of supplication/request/petition – prayer is said to make a request of God. Eg, for job, marriage, etc. It is said to ask God for his intervention on an issue or problem
- (iv) Prayer of confession – this is to confess one's sins upon violation of God's laws and ask for forgiveness.
- (v) Dedication / Consecration – It is said to submit and dedicate one's life to God and to be holy before God. Purifying or dedicating building / church, etc

(b) Outline four reasons why Christians pray

12 marks

- (i) To express thanks / gratitude to God for his providence, mercy, etc
- (ii) To express regret and ask for forgiveness.
- (iii) To seek assistance for others in trouble.
- (iv) To renew and maintain relationship with God
