a. Five lessons learnt from the life of Tweneboa Kodua

QUESTION 2

Practices of the Religious groups

(i) <u>Time of worship in Islam</u>

Islamic worship takes place at any time of the day except when the sun is rising or it is at its highest level, when the sun is setting. The time of worship in Islam coincides with the five periods of prayers. 4 marks.

(ii) Bible studies in Christian worship

Christians use Sunday worship period to study the word of God. They divide themselves into various groups and study the lesson or topic from the Bible. It is the feeding of the soul with the living word. 4 marks

(iii)Group/Congregational worship

This type of prayer takes place in temples, chapels and cathedrals. It can take place during the day either in the morning or evening. It involves the entire church or congregation. Most of the group worship occurs on Sunday, first day of the week. The Adventist worship on Saturday, the last day of the week. 4 marks

(iv) Mode of worship in African Religion

Traditionalist worship God through drumming, dancing, offering of libation, sacrifices and rituals. These

are mostly led by the priest or priestesses. 4 marks

(v) Time of worship for African Traditional Religion

Different shrines have different days for worship. Some worship on Tuesday while others meet on Fridays. 4 marks

QUESTION 3

a. Significance of events

- (i) Bilabi-Nabi
 - * It is celebrated to mark the day Prophet Mohammed was born.
 - * Seminars are held during this festival throughout.

- * It marks the beginning of the Islamic calendar
