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## SUGGESTED SOLUTION

### SECTION A: THE ENVIRONMENT

1. (a) Explain briefly how indigenous Ghanaians understand the environment. [6 marks]

**Sample Answer:** Indigenous Ghanaians view the environment as a living entity that is both physical and spiritual. They believe that the natural world—including forests, mountains, and rivers—is inhabited by spirits, deities, and ancestors who oversee human life. This holistic understanding fosters a deep respect for nature as a source of life and sustenance.

1. (b) Describe briefly the reasons for the sacredness of the following aspects of the environment according to indigenous Ghanaian culture: (i) Land; (ii) Water bodies. [6 marks]

- **Land:** It is considered sacred because it is the "Mother Earth" (Asase Yaa) and the final resting place of the ancestors. It provides food and is a gift from God through the forefathers to be preserved for future generations.
- **Water bodies:** They are seen as dwelling places for spirits and deities (gods/goddesses). They provide life, facilitate spiritual purification, and are vital for the survival of the community.

1. (c) State four reasons why indigenous Ghanaians will take care of the environment. [8 marks]

1. To maintain spiritual harmony and avoid the anger of the gods/ancestors.
2. To ensure sustainable resources (food, water, medicine) for future generations.
3. To protect biodiversity and the ecological health of the land.
4. To preserve their cultural identity and ancestral heritage.

### SECTION B: GOD, CREATION, AND FESTIVALS

2. (a) Explain five human activities which have negatively affected God's beautiful creation. [10 marks]

1. **Deforestation:** Cutting down trees for timber or farming destroys habitats.
2. **Pollution:** Dumping waste into water bodies and releasing smoke into the air.
3. **Illegal Mining (Galamsey):** Destroys land fertility and pollutes drinking water.
4. **Bush Burning:** Kills soil organisms and contributes to climate change.
5. **Over-exploitation:** Excessive hunting or fishing leading to the depletion of species.

2. (b) State five ways by which you can protect God's creation. [10 marks]

1. Participating in **reforestation** or tree-planting exercises.
2. Properly disposing of waste to prevent **pollution**.

3. Conserving water and energy in the home.
4. Educating others about the importance of **environmental stewardship**.
5. Supporting laws and policies that protect endangered wildlife.

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### **3. (b) State four purposes of God's creation to humanity. [8 marks]**

1. **Food and Sustenance:** Plants and animals provide nutrition.
2. **Shelter and Materials:** Providing wood for furniture and fibers for clothing.
3. **Medicine:** Many plants have healing properties used in healthcare.
4. **Aesthetics and Beauty:** To beautify the environment for human enjoyment.
