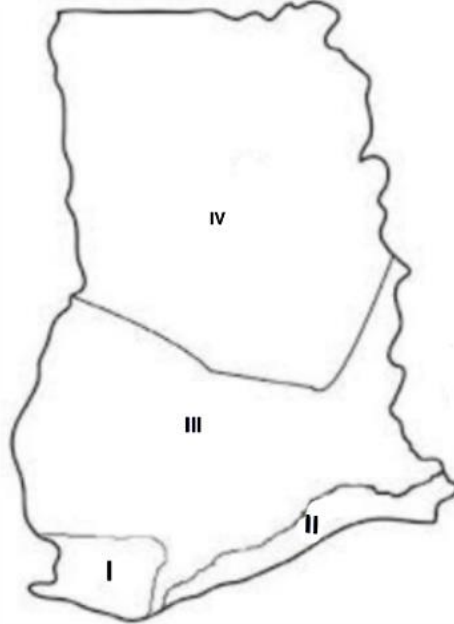

- i. If you were helping Kofi, how would you identify each of the regions labelled I, II, III, and IV on the map? (4 marks)
 - ii. To complete his project, Kofi needs to state two features for each of the climatic regions. What would you tell him about the characteristics of regions I, II, III, and IV? (8 marks)
- (b) Explain two ways of controlling flooding in the society. (8 marks)

2. (a) Ama is preparing for a class discussion on Ghana's geographical landscape. Her teacher asked her to define different types of geographical features and give one example of each.
- i. If you were Ama, how would you explain what physical features are, and what example would you give? (4 marks)
 - ii. As part of her notes, Ama also wants to understand drainage features. How would you explain this to her with one example? (4 marks)
 - iii. Ama is curious about relief features too. How would you describe them to her and what example would you mention? (4 marks)
- (b) Kweku is working on a group project about national organizations that help in weather monitoring and disaster response. He needs to present some key functions of each institution.
- i. If Kweku chooses to talk about the Ghana Meteorological Service, what four roles can he include in his presentation? (4 marks)
 - ii. For the National Disaster Management Organization (NADMO), what four responsibilities should Kweku mention? (4 marks)
3. Kojo has been chosen to represent his school at a youth leadership seminar on promoting peaceful communities. As part of his preparation, he is expected to speak on how individuals can help build peace and handle conflicts in their communities.
- i. If you were advising Kojo, what four positive attitudes would you suggest he talks about to promote peacebuilding? (4 marks)
 - ii. Kojo also needs to explain how conflicts can be managed when they arise. What four methods would you recommend he includes in his speech? (16 marks)
